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

### 1.1 Compound feed production in the main EU member states in 2014 (1000 tons)






### 1.2.1 Alerts transmitted by the feed industry (2002 – 2014)




### 1.2.2 Share of feed industry in total number alerts in 2014

### 1.2.4 Alerts transmitted by the feed industry (2014) for different types of contaminations (except petfood humid and dry)






#### 2.1.1 Turnover of the Belgian compound feed manufacturers (2000 – 2014) (in millions of euros)



### 2.2.1 Number of workers in the Belgian compound feed industry (2006 – 2014)




### 2.2.2 Share of the compound feed industry in relation to the food industry






### 2.3.1 Import of animal feed into Belgium in 2013 (tons; % of the total import)

## 2.5 Evolution of the production of porc, poultry, cattle, calf feed and other feed (Belgian affiliates of BEMEFA)


Because of changes in the methodology (other source), it is not possible to go back very far in time.

At the beginning of 2014, the classification of animal feeds has been modified. This explains the reason why some groups of animal feed have decreased or increased (substantially). The changes are as follows:

- ‘Rabbit feed’ and ‘pigeon feed’ are no longer classified into the group of ‘poultry feed’, but belong to the group of ‘other’ feed. This explains why the group ‘poultry feed’ has decreased and why the group ‘other feed’ has increased.
- The sub-classification of the ‘poultry feed’ group has been modified and contains following subgroups: chickens for fattening, laying hens, reared chickens, chickens for breeding and ‘various other’ (turkey,...).
- The ‘cattle feed’ group also has been modified since the beginning of 2014. The group contains now: young cattle feed, dairy cattle, beef cattle and artificial milk. Before that, distinction was made between: ‘calf feed’ (artificial milk, calves for fattening, rearing feed) and ‘cattle feed’ except calf feed (rearing feed, beef cattle, dairy cattle).
- The group ‘pork feed’ has been divided into : baby-piglets (up to 20 kg), piglets (20 – 40 kg), fattening pigs (> 40 kg) and sows.
- The group ‘other’ feed contains horse, rabbit, goat, sheep, fish feed and petfood and ‘various other’ (as pigeon feed).


### 2.5.1 Evolution of the production of pork feed (1000 tons)




### 2.5.2 Evolution of the production of poultry feed (1000 tons)




### 2.5.3 Evolution of the production of cattle feed(1000 tons)






### 2.7.1 Production of different types of pork feed in 2014 (%)




### 2.7.2 Verdeling van de pluimveevoederproductie in 2014 (%)




### 2.7.3 Production of different types of poultry feed in 2014 (%)




#### 2.7.4 Production of different types of 'other feed' in 2014 (%)



#### 2.7.5 Production of different types of premixes in 2014 (%)




## 2.8 Import of compound feed and premixes into Belgium by non-affiliates of BEMEFA in 2014 (tons; % of total import)

### 3 Raw materials used in the Belgian animal feed industry

**Source:** BEMEFA – The inventory, completed by the affiliates every year within the context of their participation in the monitoring plan for the food safety (monitoring of undesirable substances). The inventory contains data of the year before. In this case, the collected data are the data for 2013 ( cf. annex 3).


**Notice:** This information has to be treated with caution. The data are rather overestimated because,

- a) For some raw materials, the amount of goods for resale can be considerable;
- b) Sometimes the volumes of raw materials declared in the inventory are higher than actually volumes imported in Belgium (Foreign companies can decide to cover the quantities of raw materials used for the production of compound feed with destination other markets than the Belgian market, by the sector based sampling plan);
- c) The volume of goods in transit cannot always be deducted from these figures;
- d) The export of some types of animal feed can be considerably higher

The majority of the materials used for the production of compound feed are feed materials (97% of total use). Besides feed materials, are also used: additives and premixes.


### 3.1 Raw materials used in the Belgian animal feed industry in 2013

#### 3.1.1 Total volume of raw materials used in the Belgian animal feed industry in 2013 (%)






### 3.1.3 By-products used in the Belgian animal feed industry in 2013 (%)



### 3.2.1 Evolution of the total volume of raw materials used in the Belgian animal feed industry (2007-2013)




